

Sports Premium Funding 2017 - 18

Allenbourn currently receives £9,540 sports premium funding. This academic year the funding is due to be increased to approximately £19,000. When the school has been allocated the funds, we will up-date the web-site with information on where the extra money has been spent. In the meantime, the current funding enables the school to provide the following at KS 2:

1. Reduced class sizes in PE lessons to enable pupils to have balanced and appropriate PE provision, access to high quality teaching and learning and differentiation through small group teaching.
2. Offering all pupils more opportunities to participate in 'free' extra-curricular activities which encourages pupils to remain active and be involved in sport.
3. More opportunities for pupils to participate in level 1, 2 and 3 school games competitions in a variety of sports. Supporting the organisation, planning and running of events for Allenbourn and the East Dorset area.
4. Supporting PE staff with the organisation and administration for extra-curricular activities and competitions.
5. Providing transport to fixtures, tournaments and festivals, to enable more pupils to have the opportunity to experience competitive sport and other sporting festivals.
6. Providing expert advice and inset training for staff on athletics and other sports.

Examples of sports premium funding provided:

- Swimming lessons for all year 5 pupils, with small group teaching to non/weak swimmers
- Yr 5 and 6 extra-curricular netball club available to all pupils
- Endurance club, available to all pupils
- Sports hall and summer athletics clubs – available to all
- Hurdles club – for elite hurdlers in Yr 5 and 6
- Planning and organising the East Dorset schools cross-country competition
- Yr 5 and 6 cricket club – available to all
- Yr 5 and 6 tennis club – available to all
- Yr 5 football club
- Yr 5 & 6 Badminton Club
- Supporting Yr 5 and 6 rugby club
- Girls football and tag rugby clubs and competitive opportunities – available to all
- Inter-house competitions

Whilst the sports premium funding is intended to be for KS 2 pupils, being a Middle School means that all pupils in the school benefit from it. Many of the opportunities outlined above are carried into KS 3 and all pupils have extended opportunities that would not otherwise be available without the funding.
